## Reading Groups

In February the Children's Reading Group will meet on Friday 6th at 5pm to discuss the books short-listed for the Blue Peter Book of the Year Award. On Wednesday 11th at 2pm and 7pm there will be discussions of Independent People by Halldor Laxness. On Friday 20th there will be a meeting of the poetry group at Little Wenlock and from Wednesday 25th - 1st March we will be holding our third annual Reader's Retreat at Broniwan, near Llandysul in west Wales.

We held our first "reading Supper" of the year in Little Wenlock on January 30th. The event was hosted by Marilyn and Patrick Pietroni and the book discussed was The Grapes of Wrath by John Steinbeck. It was a wonderful evening; great food, lovely people and really thoughtful discussion. Our next reading supper is May 29th, and I will announce the book in next month's newsletter. The reading suppers cost £10 plus a bottle, first come first served.

To clarify, all events and groups are open to everyone and anyone; events need to be booked in advance to make sure of a place, but the regular reading groups can be more flexible. It is quite possible to attend a particular group because you like the look of the book, without having to commit to the whole programme. It's a good idea to let me know you intend to come in case there are any changes to the programme. (The only exception to this is the weekly classics reading group which is a closed group.)

## World Book Day Competition

Thursday March 5<sup>th</sup> is World Book day.



We will be celebrating this event on Saturday March 7<sup>th</sup> with author Manda Scott, who will be leading a writing Master-Class for winners of our annual creative writing competition for children in the Key Stage 2 age range. All children are welcome to apply - please pass this information on to any children you think might be interested. (It makes a very good half-term holiday project!) To enter the

competition:

1. Write a story on the theme of "environment". This should be their own original writing.
2. The story should be not less than 100 and not more than 500 words long.
3. Write the child's name, school, and home and school phone number on the back of every page submitted.
4. Entries must be received at the bookshop by Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> February with a £2 entrance fee.

Six winners will be selected by the judge, whose decision is final. Winners will be notified via their school by Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> March, and the winners will attend the writing master-class at Wenlock Books on Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> March with Manda Scott. Writing books and pencils, lunch and drinks and biscuits will all be provided.

### **Poetry Club**

This is a new venture for children aged 8 - 11 (or thereabouts!) We will meet in the bookshop from 4 - 5pm and read poetry together. The children can bring in their favourite poems to read aloud and I will also have a selection of poems available. The emphasis will be on sharing great poetry and giving children an opportunity to extend their knowledge of poetry in a relaxed and fun atmosphere. The Poetry Club will start on Tuesday February 24<sup>th</sup> and meet each Tuesday up to and including March 24<sup>th</sup> - 5 sessions in all. Drinks and snacks will be provided. £2 per session. (It will be helpful if you let me know if your child is coming).
